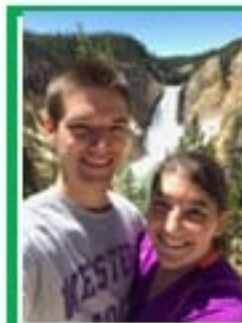


## News from Nurse Jen

Cold & Flu Season . The following are reasons to keep your child home from school

1. Your child does not feel well enough to participate in normal activities.
2. Your child needs more care than staff can give and still care for other children.
3. Your child's illness is on this list:
  - Diarrhea (child may return 24 hours after last episode)
  - Fever (100 degrees - child should be fever free for 24 hours without medication before returning to school)
  - Flu-like symptoms
  - Cough (severe, uncontrolled, or wheezing)
  - Rash with fever
  - Vomiting - (child may return 24 hours after last episode)

**If your child presents with these symptoms during the day, you will be called to pick him/her up.**
